Criteria for awarding doctoral scholarship for the II-IV year of studies acknowledged by the Council of the Faculty of Physics, Astronomy and Informatics on 21.03.2018

- 1. The criteria and rules apply to the participants of Doctoral Study during the second, third and fourth year of studies at the Faculty of Physics, Astronomy and Informatics (hereinafter referred to as WFAilS). Scholarships are awarded on the basis of the regulation by the Minister of Science and Higher Education from 9 August 2017 on doctoral studies and scholarships (Journal of Laws from 2017, item 1696). The final ranking list is recommended by the Doctoral Study Commission, in cooperation with the Faculty Doctoral Scholarship Commission, the Head of Doctoral Study and the Dean of WFAilS.
- 2. The Doctoral Study Commission includes at least three academic teachers employed by WFAilS who have the academic degree of at least Ph.D., including the Head of Doctoral Study and a representative of doctoral students nominated by the Faculty Council of Doctoral Students.
- 3. The Dean of WFAilS sets the number of scholarships per a study program (1. Physics, 2. Physics and Biophysics), for which separate rankings are made.
- 4. The ranking lists are made during the meeting of a commission which includes the Dean, the Head of Doctoral Study and members of the Doctoral Scholarship Commission.
- 5. The doctoral students eligible for applying for a doctoral scholarship are the ones who:
 - a) realize the program of doctoral studies according to schedule, especially in the case of fourth year doctoral students applying for a scholarship a necessary condition is initiated procedure of review and acceptance of the doctoral thesis,
 - b) carry out their didactic duties in a satisfactory manner,
 - c) demonstrate commitment to scientific research conducted at WFAiIS.
 - d) demonstrated progress in academic work and writing up their doctoral research during the academic year preceding the scholarship application
- 6. The basis for the evaluation of second-, third- and fourth-year doctoral students is annual report for the academic year preceding the scholarship application, submitted by the doctoral student according to the model acknowledged by WFAilS, assessed and signed by research supervisor, and in terms of the taught classes confirmed by the person responsible for class allocation at WFAilS or its units. Both lack of the opinion of research supervisor or

- dissertation advisor and lack of their signatures results in rejection of the scholarship application.
- 7. The report mentioned in point 6 should include a summary of the applicant's academic accomplishments, especially in terms of:
 - a) publications (author, title, journal, year of publication, volume number, page numbers, DOI, Ministry's score)
 - b) acquired patents and patent applications
 - c) participation in international conferences (place, date of conference, manner of presentation of scientific achievements)
 - d) participation (formal) in a research project
- 8. Application for a doctoral scholarship should include the student's personal data: name, surname, Polish Resident Identification Number (PESEL), and in case of not having it- the number of document confirming identity, and the year of doctoral studies.
- 9. Scholarship applications are evaluated according to the system presented in the table below:

10. The total amount of scientific scholarships received by a single doctoral student, namely a doctoral scholarship awarded on the basis of Article 200 of Higher Education Law, and a scholarship for doctoral students participating in research of developmental studies awarded on the basis of Article 19, section 2 of the Act from 30 April

2010 on the rules of funding science, coming from the resources of WFAilS cannot exceed 2000PLN per month.
